International Access to Information Day is held on 28 September every year and recognises the community's right to access government-held information.

The theme for International Access to Information Day (**IAID**) 2020 is *Building trust through transparency*. The right to access State and local government documents under the FOI Act assists the public to hold governments accountable in times of crisis, when critical decisions about health or public safety, the economy and human rights are being made. Access to information can lead to better decision-making and transparency, which ultimately builds trust.

IAID is designed to raise awareness of every individual's right of access to government-held information; and the public sector's responsibility to release information, if it is in the public interest to do so.
